We have had a busy few weeks. We did a jewellery making workshop which was super fun! We made submarines, hot air balloons and rockets in art. We are hoping the eggs in our incubator will hatch. We have been practicing writing. We have been focusing on transport in Aistear. We learnt about Amelia Earhart and Neil Armstrong. We have been learning some new dance routines with Shauna! We really have enjoyed our music lessons with Carrie. We are going to make little rafts with magnets. We learned some Irish songs for Seachtain na Gaeilge and really enjoyed the activities. We are really excited for everything coming up in Term 3!

1st and 2nd class - (Mrs. Hickey's class):

1st and 2nd class really enjoyed their trip to the Lidl Farm for the Farm to Fork experience. They learned about sowing crops and they saw lots of different types of fruits and vegetables that had been planted and were growing inside polytunnels. They even learned about pollination. They were so lucky to get a train ride through the distribution centre which was the highlight of the trip for many. The kids have been working hard on poetry over the past 3 weeks.
